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Term 4 in review

Where has the year gone to? Term 4 has been a busy term, as we explored our focus of learning (for the first 5 weeks of term)

Of course, later in term 4 we had so many special Christmas activities to engage in. And the term calendar provided lots of excitement and curiosity as we have counted down the weeks to events, holidays and Christmas.

This term children have attended their school orientation visits and we have seen 60 children transition into preschool.

Wonderful celebration days

What wonderful celebration days we had last week. The children were sensational singing 13 songs for us. Learning the words & actions for 14 songs is an incredible effort. I was so proud of them! I am sure you were too. Children do really amaze us—what they are capable of and how they go about their "work and play".

We were so lucky with the weather. It was perfect temperature for the concert and the pizza lunch that followed, on the lawns after. It was just lovely seeing the children dressed for the occasion, performing a number of songs, some of which involved some "acting out", giving out their gift, sharing in lunch together and enjoying each others company. It was truly a wonderful day.

Thank you for supporting your child on this special occasion. We hope you enjoyed the day too. Thank you for such wonderful feedback following our celebration days. It was very much appreciated.

Thankyou also to the staff for their amazing efforts organizing the props for the songs, supporting and preparing children in the weeks prior to celebration days. Of course on the day, staff had to organize the interactive screen, give out props, organize children and monitor how children were coping, throughout the concert. It is a huge job for all staff, all taking their roles during the concert but also prior to the concert, then engaging with the community through lunch.

Many parents commented on the children's art work they received as their Christmas gift. Some families thought that we / the art teachers helped the children. However, the children did do it themselves. The art teacher demonstrated to the children first, then the children were given their piece of paper & commenced with drawing their self portrait. Once the drawing was completed they were each given some palette paints / brush & water.

The finished art work was truly amazing! The paper & the paints used are very high quality and that does make a difference to the children's work. But it definitely was their own work! We just put them on coloured card and had them laminated.

We hope you cherish the paintings for years to come. (Some families from previous years had them framed. Apparently Ikea sells large frames.)

Graduation Afternoons

As mentioned in previous newsletters, the Governing Council brought forward this years graduations to ensure the children graduated from preschool, in my last week at Mitcham Preschool. Therefore,

To celebrate a wonderful year of teaching and learning we will hold a special graduation afternoon at the preschool on

Blue group—Thursday December 8th Gold group—Friday December 9th

To celebrate their journey at preschool our graduation day will be as follows

- 8.45am—session starts as usual
 - Kindy as normal
- Children will have their last lunch together at kindy! We will have an early lunch!
 - 12.45pm—parents return for afternoon tea
 - 1.30pm —Graduation commences
 - 2.30pm—Graduation concludes
